Reading Turowicz: “Our Everyday Indifference” | online – ZOOM

“I will speak of things which seem banal and obvious, but these are things that need to be constantly repeated, so they are forever present in the memory of Poles, Europeans, or, simply, people” – this is how Jerzy Turowicz began his speech during the conference titled “Polish Memory – Jewish Memory,” which took place in 1995 in the French Institute in Krakow. This was 50 years after the war, 50 years after the Shoah. Turowicz spoke of antisemitism as a phenomenon that we need to fight. It had already been revived on a visible scale both in Poland and around the world. How is it today? Can we speak about these “banal and obvious” things in a convincing manner, especially to younger generations who might not have the chance to meet witnesses of the Shoah face to face?

Blintzes in Fire. Culinary workshop with Kasia Leonardi |

Have you ever wondered about the origins of a crepe? Have you ever heard of blintzes? Blintzes (inYiddish) are traditional tube-shaped crepes with filling. They were brought to New York by Ashkenazi Jews and they quickly gained fame. They are similar to a Polish crepe, a French crepe, or Russian blini. Usually they are served on Shavuot with a sweet cottage cheese filling. As Leo Rosten noted in his “The Joys of Yiddish:” “you never speak of blintzes in singular, perhaps because no one has ever heard of anyone eating just one of them.” During the workshop we will add some fire to traditional blintzes! We will learn the secrets of flambéing and caramelizing fruit, while Kasia demonstrates how to prepare flaming decorations. Sign up today!
